**TODAY'S GAME:** The Generals and Braves play game four of the five-game series today at Pringles Park. The Braves lead the all-time series 74-72. The two teams will meet 13 times this season, 10 times at Pringles Park.

**GENERALS RECAP:** – The first place Generals (9-4) blanked the Mississippi Braves (4-9) on Tuesday night at Pringles Park, 7-0. **Taijuan Walker** and **Jandy Sena** combined for the three-hit shutout, the first of the 2012 season for Jackson. The Generals are the first to nine wins in the Southern League. Walker (2-0) tossed six shutout innings, allowing just two hits while striking out seven and walking one. Sena earned a three inning save and surrendered just one hit and struck out one in his 2012 Generals debut. **Joe Dunigan** was 2-for-4 with a homer, two RBI and two runs. **Jesus Sucre** was 2-for-4 with a double, run and three RBI. **Rich Poythress** finished the night 2-for-3 with a double, RBI and run scored.

**WHO'S HOT?:** **Jesus Sucre** has a team best 7-game hitting streak. **Joe Dunigan** has recorded back-to-back games with a homer and 8 hits in the current series, batting .533 (8x15) with 5 runs scored, 2 doubles, 2 home runs and 3 RBI. The **Generals pitching staff** has struck out a league-best 128 batters so far this season and also lead the league with a 2.29 ERA. **RH Carter Capps** (6.2 IP), **LH Brian Moran** (6.0), **RH Moises Hernandez** (4.2) and **LH Steve Garrison** (4.1) have yet to allow a run this season. The bullpen is a combined 4-1 with 4 saves and a 1.23 ERA (7ER, 51.1 IP) while walking 19 and striking out 55 strikeouts this season.

**25 STRAIGHT GAMES:** The Generals are in the midst of the longest stretch of games without a day off. Jackson plays everyday from April 5 to April 29, having their first day off finally on April 30.

**TRANSACTIONS:** On Monday LHP **Steve Garrison** and OF **Daniel Carroll** were both placed on the 7-day disabled list. OF **Kalian Sams** was reinstated from the disabled list and transferred from High Desert to Jackson. RHP **Jandy Sena** was also promoted from High Desert.

**PAXTON SL PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** LHP **James Paxton** was named Southern League Player of the Week, April 5-15. Paxton went 1-0 with a 0.87 ERA (1 ER, 10.1 IP), while walking 1 and striking out 17 in his first 2 start this season. He has limited opponents to a .167 (6x36), while allowing only 1 extra-base hit (2B). He currently ranks T2nd in the league in strikeouts (17) and T5th in ERA (0.87). The 23-year-old lefty is rated as the No. 3 prospect for the Seattle Mariners, according to Baseball America. He was drafted by Seattle in the fourth round of the 2010 draft out of the University of Kentucky.

**GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP 100 PROSPECTS:** The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers **Danny Hultzen** (16), **Taijuan Walker** (18) and **James Paxton** (77) and short stop **Nick Franklin** (52).

**MARINERS FUTURE IN JACKSON:** *Baseball America* lists 10 Generals as top 30 Mariners prospects in their latest publication, including the top four and five of the top six on the list. P **Taijuan Walker** (1), P **Danny Hultzen** (2), P **James Paxton** (3), INF **Nick Franklin** (4), INF **Francisco Martinez** (6), P **Stephen Pryor** (15), P **Carter Capps** (16), P **Brandon Maurer** (21), OF **Johermyn Chavez** (28), INF **Rich Poythress** (29)

**Tonight's Start:** 21-year-old right-hander Brandon Maurer makes the game three start tonight for the Generals against the Mississippi Braves at Pringles Park. It's his 45th career outing, 36th career start for the fifth-year right-hander out of Costa Mesa, CA.

**Last Outing:** Maurer allowed one run on seven hits in 5.0 innings last Thursday night, striking out two and walking three against the Smokies. Maurer took a no decision as Jackson went on to beat the Smokies 4-1 for their fourth straight win and third in-a-row over Tennessee.

**2011 in Review:** Began season with Clinton...struck out a season high 11 batters May 7 vs. Burlington (6.0,3,1,1,2,11,BK)...promoted to High Desert on May 17...named California League Pitcher of the Week, May 23-29, after allowing only 3 hit over 8.0 shutout innings, Aug. 25 vs. Modesto (8.0,3,0,0,0,9)...made two stints on the disabled list with a strained right elbow (June 11-29 and July 18-end of season).
