

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Generals and Barons meet again tonight at Pringles Park for game two of the opening five-game series, with first pitch set for 7:05. The North Division foe Barons are looking to even the series at one game apiece. The Tennessee Smokies and Generals were the only North Division teams to win their opener last night.

<u>GENERALS RECAP:</u> – Andrew Carraway (1-0) tossed six shutout innings as Jackson (1-1) held for a 3-2 victory over the Birmingham Barons (1-0) Thursday night at Pringles Park. The Generals are 11-4 all-time on opening day. The crowd of 4,645 was treated to great pitching on Thursday as only Nick Franklin (2x3) tallied a multi-hit game. The Generals only hit with runners in scoring position occurred with two outs in the third, a two-RBI double off the bat of **Rich Poythress**. **Daniel Carroll** stole a second base after reaching on an error in the fifth inning and eventually scored on a wild pitch from Birmingham reliever Henry Mabee. The run proved pivotal as Birmingham's Jared Mitchell (1x4) singled in two runs in the top of the ninth against Stephen Pryor.

GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP 100 PROSPECTS: The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers Danny Hultzen (16), Taijuan Walker (18) and James Paxton (77) and short stop Nick Franklin (52).

MARINERS FUTURE IN JACKSON: Baseball America lists 11 Generals as Top 30 Mariners prospects in their latest publication, including the top four and five of the top six on the list. P Taijuan Walker (1), P Danny Hultzen (2), P James Paxton (3), INF Nick Franklin (4), INF Francisco Martinez (6), P Stephen Pryor (15), P Carter Capps (16), P Brandon Maurer (21), OF Chih-Hsien Chiang (24), OF Johermyn Chavez (28), INF Rich Poythress (29)

**DOMINATING THE SPRING:** The four full-season Mariners minor league teams finished spring training play with an impressive 31-14-3 record.

THEY ARE TALKING ABOUT US: "The Seattle Mariners have suffered through some lean times as of late, but help is on the way. Seattle's SL affiliate, the Jackson Generals, will likely boast one of the most talented rosters in all of Minor League Baseball, on both sides of the player equation." MLB.com

No other team in the minors can boast four Top 100 Prospects. With RHP Taijuan Walker (No. 20) and LHPs Danny Hultzen (No. 21) and James Paxton (No. 52)—along with SS Nick Franklin (No. 77)—Jackson fans are sure to get an elite prospect on the mound three out of every five days." Baseball America on being named the most talented MiLB team.

<u>GENERALS IN THE SHOW:</u> Four 2011 Generals made the Mariners Opening Day, 25-man roster. Pitchers **Tom Wilhelmsen**, **Steve Delabar** and **Erasmo Ramirez**, along with infielder **Kyle Seager**.

<u>SCOUTING THE BARONS:</u> Jackson was 9-5 against the Birmingham Barons last season and 6-3 against the White Sox Double-A affiliate. The Generals batted .263 as a team with 13 homer and 68 RBI against the Barons in 2011. As a pitching staff the Generals held a team ERA of 4.15 and a .259 opponents batting average.

Tonight's Start: 23-year-old left-hander James Paxton makes the game two start tonight for the Generals against the Birmingham Barons at Pringles Park It's his 22nd career outing, 22nd career start for the third-year right-hander out of Ladner, British Columbia, Canada.

Last Outing: In Paxton's last spring training start on 3/29, allowed three runs, two earned on six hits in 4.2 innings against AA Pensacola in Surprise, AZ. Paxton walked none and struck out three as Jackson beat Pensacola 7-3.

Highly Ranked: Paxton ranks as the 4th best prospect in the Mariners organization, according to Baseball America. He ranks as the 8th best left-handed pitching prospect and 77th overall prospect in baseball, according to MLB.com

2011 Season in Review: Combined to go 6-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 ER, 95.0 IP) in 17 starts with A Clinton and AA Jackson...recorded 131 strikeouts, T2nd-most among Mariners farmhands...among all minor league players with at least 90.0 IP, ranked 2nd averaging 12.41 K/9.0 IP...tallied 6 games with 10+ strikeouts...

Pax To the Future: Paxton was named to the 2011 XM Satellite Radio All-Star Futures Game as part of the MLB All-Star festivities at Chase Field in Phoenix, AZ. Paxton tossed a shutout third frame on July 10th. Paxton started the third inning as part of the World Team in the Futures Game. The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder needed just six pitches to retire three of the top prospects in baseball - hitting 1-2-3 in the order - Cleveland Indians second baseman Jason Kipnis, Baltimore Orioles shortstop Manny Machado and Bryce Harper, the Washington Nationals outfielder and former No. 1 overall pick in the 2010 MLB Draft, currently ranked as the No. 1 prospect in baseball.

Jump from Low-A to Double-A: Transferred from Low-A Clinton to Jackson on 6/30. He went 3-3 with a 2.73 ERA (17 ER in 56.0 IP), struck out 80 while walking 30 and limiting opponents to a .225 average. Paxton struck out 10plus batters on a team-best three separate occasions, including a 13-strikeout game against Quad Cities on June 16 leading up to the Midwest League All-Star Game.

Pro Debut: Made his long-awaited professional debut for Clinton on 4/27 vs. Peoria and took the loss despite making a quality start...he allowed three runs on five hits including a two-run HR by Greg Rohan, walked four and struck out six over 6.0 innings in Clinton's 7-2 loss. He'd miss his next scheduled outing for 5/2 vs. Beloit after being hit in the left shoulder by a ball during batting practice, but would return on schedule for his next start, 5/8 vs. Burlington.

Indy Ball in 2010: Did not immediately sign after being selected in the 4th round of the 2010 June draft...made 4 starts for Grand Prairie in the independent American Association (1-2 4.08 ERA, 18 SO, 7 BB) prior to the 2010 draft

Time at Kentucky: three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll... pitched for the University of Kentucky from 2007-09...was 11-5 with a 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 strikeouts in 55 games (24 starts) for the Wildcats...finished his junior season (2009) ranked 17th in the nation and 4th
