TODAY'S GAME: The Generals and Barons meet tonight at 6:05 for game three of the five-game opening series of the season. A win tonight for Jackson will clinch the series. The Generals face their now North Division foe Barons, just 10 times this season. This is the lone series occurring at Pringles Park.

GENERALS RECAP: — James Paxton fanned 10 over 5.2 innings Friday night as the Generals defeated Birmingham 2-1. During the first two games of the season, Generals starters **Andrew Carraway** and Paxton have combined to toss 11.2 shutout innings on four hits while striking out 16 and walking just one. Paxton (1-0) earned the win and walked none, surrendering just two hits. Jose Quintana yielded just two runs over 5.2 innings for the Barons, but suffered the loss. With the Generals leading 2-1 in the ninth, the Barons put two runners on base against reliever **Carter Capps**. He went on to strike out the next three batters to end the game and earn his first save. At the plate, **Nick Franklin** tallied his second straight multi-hit game, finishing 2-for-4, with an RBI single in the bottom of the sixth. **Rich Poynthress** was 2-for-3 and added another RBI double in the fourth inning, giving him three RBI in the first two games.

RECORD OPENING NIGHT: The opening night attendance of 4,645 was the largest opening night crowd since April 6, 2000. During the first two nights 6,936 fans have taken in Generals baseball.

GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP 100 PROSPECTS: The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers **Danny Hultzen** (16), **Taijuan Walker** (18) and **James Paxton** (77) and short stop **Nick Franklin** (52).

MARINERS FUTURE IN JACKSON: *Baseball America* lists 11 Generals as Top 30 Mariners prospects in their latest publication, including the top four and five of the top six on the list. Tonight's Start: 21-year-old right-hander Brandon Maurer makes the game three start tonight for the Generals against the Birmingham Barons at Pringles Park. It's his 43rd career outing, 34th career start for the fifth-year right-hander out of Costa Mesa, CA.

Last Outing: In Maurer's last spring training start on 3/27, tossed 3.2 scoreless innings against AA Frisco in Peoria, AZ. Maurer walked one and struck out one as Jackson beat the Rangers AA team Frisco 6-2.

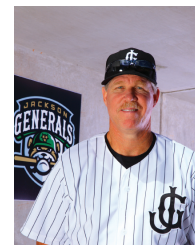
