TODAY'S GAME: Tonight the Generals look to snap a two-game losing skid in game two of the five-game set with the Blue Wahoos in Pensacola. This is the first of two trips to Pensacola for the Generals this season.

GENERALS RECAP: Pensacola's Cody Puckett singled home Koyie Hill in the bottom of the 10th inning as the Blue Wahoos came-from-behind to beat Jackson 4-5 on Tuesday night. The Generals jumped out to a 4-0 lead with 2 runs scoring in the first on RBI doubles from SS **Nick Franklin** (1x4, R, 2B, RBI, BB) and 1B **Rich Poythress** (1x5, RBI). Jackson added a run in the 2nd on a RBI groundout from 2B **Gabriel Noriega** (0x4, RBI) and a RBI double from LF **Chris** Pettit (2x5, 2B, RBI) in the 3rd. Starter Andrew Carraway (5.0,7,3,3,2,4) left the game with a 4-3 lead after allowing 3 runs on 7 hits 5.0 innings, but didn't figure into the decision. LH Brian Moran (0.2,2,1,0,0,0) suffered the loss allowing an unearned run in the 10th. DH Joe Dunigan (2x4, SB), 3B Francisco Martinez (2x5, R, 2B, SB) and C Jesus Sucre (2x4) also recorded 2 hits in the game.

WHO'S HOT?: After allowing 2 runs in his 2nd relief appearance on April 8, LH Bobby LaFromboise has not allowed a run in his last 11.2 innings. During this stretch he limited opponents to a .158 average (6x38) while walking 2 and striking out 14. LaFromboise has lowered his ERA from 7.71 to 1.29 in his last 6 relief appearances.

In 5 starts this season, Danny Hultzen is 2-2 with a 2.05 ERA (6 ER, 26.1 IP). He has limited opponents to a .149 average (14x94), which is the lowest in the Southern League, while walking 12 and striking out 30. Of his 14 hits allowed only 3 have gone for extra-bases (2 2B, 3B).

• OF Joe Dunigan has hit in each of his last 6 games, batting .400 (10x25) with 6 runs scored, 3 doubles, 2 home runs and 4 RBI.

OF Chris Pettit has hit safely in 7 straight games, batting .357 (10x28) with 3 runs scored, 4 doubles, 1 triple and 4 RBI.

DOUBLE YOUR GENERALS: The Generals are tied with Huntsville in 1st place in the Southern League with 50 doubles this season. Rich Poythress (9) ranks T-2nd, Joe Dunigan (8) T-3rd and Nick Franklin is T-4th in the league.

IN A LEAGUE OF THEIR OWN: The Generals pitching staff has struck out a league-best 231 batters so far this season and also lead the league with a 2.47 ERA. The second best team in the league is Jacksonville at 3.34. 19-year-old Taijuan Walker ranks first in the league with a 1.64 ERA.

ORGANIZATIONAL RANKINGS: The Mariners were recently ranked by Baseball America No. 6 in their annual organizational talent ratings...this is a drastic improvement from when the Mariners were ranked 18th prior to last season.

<u>GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP 100 PROSPECTS:</u> The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers **Danny Hultzen** (16), **Taijuan Walker** (18) and **James Paxton** (77) and short stop **Nick Franklin** (52).

<u>Tonight's Start:</u> 23-year-old left-hander James Paxton makes the game two start tonight for the Generals against Pensacola at Blue Wahoos Park. It's his 26th career outing, 26th career start for the third-year right-hander out of Ladner, British Columbia, Canada.

<u>Last Outing:</u> Paxton notched his longest outing of the season and first quality start last Thursday, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing 1 unearned run on 3 hits. Paxton struck out 9 and walked 2. The Generals defeated Tennessee 7-2 for the fourth straight win.

<u>SL Pitcher of the Week:</u> Generals lefty James Paxton was named the Southern League Pitcher of the Week for his efforts in the first 11 days of the 2012 season. Paxton made two starts and was 1-0, with a 0.87 ERA striking out 17 and walking just one batter in 10 1/3 innings. He fanned 10 batters in his first start on April 6 against the Barons and struck out seven in his second outing last Thursday against the Smokies.

<u>Highly Ranked:</u> Paxton ranks as the 4th best prospect in the Mariners organization, according to *Baseball America*. He ranks as the 8th best left-handed pitching prospect and 77th overall prospect in baseball, according to MLB.com

2011 Season in Review: Combined to go 6-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 ER, 95.0 IP) in 17 starts with A Clinton and AA Jackson...recorded 131 strikeouts, T2nd-most among Mariners farmhands...among all minor league players with at least 90.0 IP, ranked 2nd averaging 12.41 K/9.0 IP...tallied 6 games with 10+ strikeouts...

Pax To the Future: Paxton was named to the 2011 XM Satellite Radio All-Star Futures Game as part of the MLB All-Star festivities at Chase Field in Phoenix, AZ. Paxton tossed a shutout third frame on July 10th. Paxton started the third inning as part of the World Team in the Futures Game. The 6-foot-4, 220-pounder needed just six pitches to retire three of the top prospects baseball - hitting 1-2-3 in the order - Cleveland Indians second baseman Jason Kipnis, Baltimore Orioles shortstop Manny Machado and Bryce Harper, the Washington Nationals outfielder and former No. 1 overall pick in the 2010 MLB Draft, currently ranked as the No. 1 prospect in baseball.

<u>Jump from Low-A to Double-A:</u> Transferred from Low-A Clinton to Jackson on 6/30. He went 3-3 with a 2.73 ERA (17 ER in 56.0 IP), struck out 80 while walking 30 and limiting opponents to a .225 average. Paxton struck out 10-plus batters on a team-best three separate occasions, including a 13-strikeout game against Quad Cities on June 16 leading up to the Midwest League All-Star Game

Pro Debut: Made his long-awaited professional debut for Clinton on 4/27 vs. Peoria and took the loss despite making a quality start...he allowed three runs on five hits including a two-run HR by Greg Rohan, walked four and struck out six over 6.0 innings in Clinton's 7-2 loss. He'd miss his next scheduled outing for 5/2 vs. Beloit after being hit in the left shoulder by a ball during batting practice, but would return on schedule for his next start, 5/8 vs. Burlington.

Indy Ball in 2010: Did not immediately sign after being selected in the 4th round of the 2010 June draft...made 4 starts for Grand Prairie in the independent American Association (1-2 4.08 ERA, 18 SO, 7 BB) prior to the 2010 draft

<u>Time at Kentucky:</u> three-time member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll... pitched for the University of Kentucky from 2007-09...was 11-5 with a 4.91 ERA (81 ER, 148.1 IP) and 168 strikeouts in 55 games (24 starts) for the Wildcats...finished his junior season (2009) ranked 17th in the nation and 4th in the Southeastern Conference with 115 strikeouts...also ranked 3rd in the NCAA averaging 13.22 strikeouts per 9.0 innings...selected by Toronto in the supplemental first round (39th overall) in the 2009 June draft, but did not sign.
