TODAY'S GAME: The Generals continue their 10-game, two city road trip tonight in Chattanooga, looking for their 5th straight win. The Generals and Lookouts (LAD) meet 15 times this season, 10 played at AT\&T Field. The Generals have a 3 game lead in the division. GENERALS RECAP: Starter Danny Hultzen ( $5.2,2,0,0,3,6$ ) plus relievers Yoervis Medina ( $2.1,0,0,0,1,3$ ) and Brian Moran (1.0, $, 0,0,0,0$ ) combined on a 2-hit shutout in 7-0 win over Chattanooga on Sunday afternoon. The win marked Jackson's 4th in a row and 6 th shutout of the season. Hultzen allowed 2 hits, while walking 3 and striking out 6 in 5.2 innings to record his team-leading 6 th win. SS Nick Franklin $(4 \times 4,2$ R, HR, 3 RBI, BB) homered and was 4 -for- 4 at the plate with a walk and 3 RBI. Franklin is $6 \times 6$ with a 1 in his last 7 plate appearances. Franklin, CF Denny Almonte ( $2 \times 5, ~ R, 2 B$ ), LF Kalian Sams ( $2 \times 5, ~ R, 2$ RBI), DH Joe Dunigan $(2 \times 5, R)$ and SS Gabriel Noriega ( $2 \times 3, R B I$ ) each recorded multi-hit games as the Generals out-hit the Lookouts 13-2.
FRANKLIN, HULTZEN TAKE LEAGUE HONORS: The Southern League announced today that Generals' starting pitcher Danny Hultzen was named the league's Pitcher of the Week and Nick Franklin was named Hitter of the Week. Hultzen, 22, made two starts this week, going 2-0, with a 0.00 ERA in $112 / 3$ innings. In those starts he allowed just 7 hits along with 5 walks and 12 strikeouts. Franklin, 21, this week batted . 407 (11x27), with 2 doubles, 2 triples, 2 home runs, 6 RBI, 5 runs and 3 walks. His on-base percentage this week was .467 and slugging percentage, .852 .
TOPS IN THE LEAGUE: The Generals have the best record in the Southern League, $35-22$ and boast the best ERA in the league at 2.90. The next closest is Mobile with a 3.50 team ERA.
10-DAY ROAD TRIP: The continue their longest road trip of the season, visiting Chattanooga and Jacksonville for 5 games in each city. The Generals are 15-12 away from Pringles Park this season.
WHO'S HOT?: 3B Francisco Maritinez has hit safely 8 of his last 9 games, batting . 333 ( $12 \times 36$ ) with 6 runs scored, 5 doubles and 3 RBI. $->$ C Jesus Sucre is batting $.480(12 \times 25)$ with 4 runs scored, 1 double and 3 RBI in his last 7 games. He has also hit safely in 8 of his last 10 games with 6 multi-hit games. During this stretch he is batting .459 (17x37) with 4 runs scored, 1 double and 5 RBI . $\rightarrow>$ INF Nick Franklin has hit safely 13 of his last 16 games, batting .393 ( $24 \times 61$ ) with 8 runs scored, 6 doubles, 4 triples, 2 home runs and 11 RBI. -> OF Denny Almonte is batting $.423(11 \times 26)$ with 5 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 5 RBI in last 7 games.
-> LH Bobby LaFromboise has allowed only 1 earned run in his last 23.2 innings in relief ( 0.38 ERA ). During his last 15 relief appearances he has limited opponents to a . 136 average ( $11 \times 81$ ), while walking 4 and striking out 26 . He has not allowed a hit to the last 21 batters faced ( $1 \mathrm{BB}, 7 \mathrm{~K}$ ).
STREAK CONTINUES FOR CAMPBELL: 27-year-old utility man Eric Campbell walked yesterday and extended his on-base streak to 24-straight games. It is the longest active streak and 1 away from the longest in the league this season. Campbell is batting . 291 in the streak. PRYOR MAKES MLB DEBUT: The first 2012 Jackson General to make a major league debut was Stephen Pryor. The righthander struck out Paul Konerko of the White Sox with a 100 MPH fastball with two outs and 2 runners on base. In $21 / 3$ innings Saturday and Sunday, Pryor allowed one run and struck out four White Sox batters.
THE FLAME THROWER: RH Carter Capps has not allowed a run in his last 14.2 innings in relief ( 10 games). This season he is 2-2 with 5 saves and a 1.65 ERA ( 5 ER, 27.1 IP). He has limited opponents to a .206 ( $21 \times 102$ ) average, while walking 6 and striking out 39. Capps has held opponents scoreless in 16 of 19 relief appearances this season. His 12.84 strikeouts per 9.0 innings currently ranks 3rd amongst relievers in the Southern League.
GENERALS BOAST FOUR TOP-100 PROSPECTS: The Generals opening day roster features four top 100 prospects, according to MLB.com. Pitchers Danny Hultzen (16), Taijuan Walker (18) and James Paxton (77) and short stop Nick Franklin (52).

Tonight's Start: 25 -year-old left-hander Steve Garrison makes the game three start tonight for the Generals against Chattanooga This is Garrison's 6th start of the year and 3rd on the road (1-0, 2.19). It's his 135th career outing, 117th career start for the 6th-year right-hander out of Trenton, NJ.

Last Outing: Garrison logged his 1st quality start last Tuesday against Pensacola at Pringles Park. Garrison allowed 2 runs on 7 hits over 6.0 innings, striking out 2 and walking 2. The Generals defeated the Blue Wahoos 4-2.

MLB Debut in 2011: Spent bulk of season with AA Trenton...recalled from minors on July 19 and made his Major League debut July 25 vs. Seattle ( 0.2 ShO IP)...optioned back to Trenton on July 29 and designated for assignment on Sept. 11...went 4-8 with a 5.95 ERA (50 ER, 75.2 IP ) in 17 G/16 GS with AA Trenton....held left-handed batters to a 259 batting average ( $21 \times 81$ ), compared to 336 ( $81 \times 241$ ) vs. right-handers...pair of trips to the minor league DL: May 4-June 25 with left groin strain \& Aug. 19-31 with left finger laceration made one rehab appearance with Staten Island, throwing 5.0 shutout innings on June 21.
