TODAY'S GAME: The Generals open the home portion of the schedule tonight with the opener of a five-game series against the Montgomery Biscuits at The Ballpark. Jackson is 71-70 all-time against the Biscuits.

Hey, Generals beat writer for the Jackson Sun, Josh Lemons... YOU ALREADY KNOW...that tonight is Opening Night at The Ballpark in Jackson. But, <u>DID YOU KNOW?</u>...that last year's 3-2 win over Birmingham broke a four-game losing streak for Jackson in home openers. The Jackson franchise is 7-8, all-time in home openers at The Ballpark in Jackson.

GENERALS RECAP: Starter James Gillheeney and releivers Forrest Snow, Tyler Burgoon and Carson Smith combined to shutout Jacksonville as the Generals earned a 1-0 win on Monday afternoon. It was the second consecutive game the Generals have shutout the Suns. Jackson's starting rotation staff not allowed a run in the last 23.0 consecutive innings. Gillheeny (5.0,3,0,0,1,2) allowed only 3 hits, while walking 1 and striking out 2 in 5.0 innings to earn his first win of the season. Snow (1.2,1,0,0,0,2), Burgoon (1.1,1,0,0,1,2) and Smith (1.0,0,0,0,1) combined to strikeout 5 batters over the final 4.0 innings in relief, while Smith recorded his first Double-A save of this career. CF Francisco Martinez (1x3, RBI) drove in 3B Vinnie Catricala (0x3, R, HBP) in the 2nd inning on a RBI groundout for the only run of the game. RF James Jones (1x4, 2B), DH Julio Morban (1x1, 2B) and 2B Gabriel Noriega (1x3) each recorded one of Jackson's 4 hits in the game.

WHO'S HOT: OF Julio Morban has recorded multi-hit games in 3 of the first 5 games, batting .563 (9x16) with 3 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 3 RBI. INF Brad Miller has hit safely in 3 of the first 5 games this season, batting .350 (7x20) with 3 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 home run and 1 RBI.

40-MAN FRENZY: For the first time since Jackson has been affiliated with Seattle (2007) they boast 6 players who are on the Mariners 40-man roster. Starting pitchers **Hector Noesi** and **Chance Ruffin**, infielder **Vinnie Catricala** outfielders **Francisco Martinez** and **Julio Morban** and starter **Anthony Fernandez** who is currently on the DL.

COMING FROM BIG LEAGUE CAMP: The Opening Day roster features 12 players that participated in Major League Spring Training. Those included position players Abraham Almonte, Vinnie Catricala, John Hicks, Francisco Martinez, Brad Miller, Julio Morban and pitchers Jonathan Arias, Tyler Burgoon, Stephen Kohscheen, Hector Noesi, Chance Ruffin, Carson Smith and Taijuan Walker.

<u>"PANK" MOVING ON UP</u>: Coming back for his 3rd season, Manager Jim Pankovits becomes the second-longest tenured Jackson manager. Bobby Dickerson managed in Jackson from 2002-2005 while Jackson was affiliated with the Chicago Cubs. Pankovits ranks 3rd in franchise history with 149 managerial wins.

HISTORIC YEAR FOR MARINERS MINORS: The Mariners 9 minor league affiliates wrapped up the 2012 season, putting together one of the best seasons in club history, combining for a 496-406 (.550) record. The organization led all Major League farm systems in wins (496) and winning percentage (.550). The Mariners 496 organizational wins set a new record for most wins in a single system. Six of the Mariners 9 affiliates qualified for the postegon in 2012
