TODAY'S GAME: The Generals play a doubleheader today at The Ballpark in Jackson. This is the first twin bill of the season. Last year Jackson was 8-8 in 7-inning games, splitting six DH's, sweeping one and losing one.

YOU ALREADY KNOW...that the Generals have hit 4 home runs this season. But, DID YOU KNOW?...that the Jackson franchise has blasted 1,498 home runs since moving from Memphis in 1998.

GENERALS RECAP: Jackson scored 3 runs in the 7th inning, including a 2-run home run by Steven Proscia, but it wasn't enough at the Generals lost to Montgomery 4-3 on Wednesday night. Jackson out-hit Montgomery 10-8, with SS Brad Miller (2x4), DH Francisco Martinez (2x4) and 3B Steven Procia (2x4, R, HR, 2 RBI) each recording 2 hits. RF Leon Landry (1x4, R, HR, RBI) knocked in the Generals 3rd run with his first home run of the season in the 7th. Starter Taijuan Walker (5.0,4,3,0,2,5) recorded his 2nd loss of the season despite not allowing an earned run (3 R) in 5.0 innings of work. RH Jonathan Arias (2.0,2,1,1,0,1) and RH Andrew Kittredge (2.0,2,0,0,1,3) each worked 2.0 innings in relief.

WHO'S HOT: OF Julio Morban has recorded multi-hit games in 3 of the first 5 games, batting .563 (9x16) with 3 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 3 RBI. INF Brad Miller has hit safely in 4 of the first 6 games this season, batting .375 (9x24) with 3 runs scored, 1 double, 1 triple, 1 home run and 1 RBI.

STARTERS STREAK: Over the last five games and 28.0 innings, the Generals starting rotation has not allowed an earned run. In those starts, starters have allowed only 11 hits.

40-MAN FRENZY: For the first time since Jackson has been affiliated with Seattle (2007) they boast 6 players who are on the Mariners 40-man roster. Starting pitchers Hector Noesi and Chance Ruffin, infielder Vinnie Catricala outfielders Francisco Martinez and Julio Morban and starter Anthony Fernandez who is currently on the DL.

COMING FROM BIG LEAGUE CAMP: The Opening Day roster features 12 players that participated in Major League Spring Training. Those included position players Abraham Almonte, Vinnie Catricala, John Hicks, Francisco Martinez, Brad Miller, Julio Morban and pitchers Jonathan Arias, Tyler Burgoon, Stephen Kohscheen, Hector Noesi, Chance Ruffin, Carson Smith and Taijuan Walker.

"PANK" MOVING ON UP: Coming back for his 3rd season, Manager Jim Pankovits becomes the second-longest tenured Jackson manager. Bobby Dickerson managed in Jackson from 2002-2005 while Jackson was affiliated with the Chicago Cubs. Pankovits ranks 3rd in franchise history with 149 managerial wins.

HISTORIC YEAR FOR MARINERS MINORS: The Mariners 9 minor league affiliates wrapped up the 2012 season, putting together one of the best seasons in club history, combining for a 496-406 (.550) record. The organization led all Major League farm systems in wins (496) and winning

percentage (.550). The Mariners 496 organizational wins set a new record for most wins in a single sesaon by any Major League farm system. Six of the Mariners 9 affiliates qualified for the postseason in 2012.

PLENTY OF PROSPECTS: The Generals Opening Day roster features 11 of the Mariners' Top-30 prospects, according to Baseball America. Those include: RHP Taijuan Walker (2), INF Brad Miller (9), RHP Carson Smith (16), OF Leon Landry (17), INF Jack Marder (20), C John Hicks (21), OF Francisco Martinez (22), OF Julio Morban (23), INF Vinnie Catricala (26), RHP Chance Ruffin (27), LHP Anthony Fernandez (30).

Tonight's Start: 24-year-old Roenis Elias makes his first home start for the Generals tonight against the Montgomery Biscuits in game one of the doubleheader. This is his first career start against the Biscuits and 36th overall start in his pro career.

<u>Last Outing:</u> Elias tossed 6.0 no-hit innings last Friday in his first ever Double-A start at Jacksonville. The lefty was removed after six frames because of reaching his pitch count. He threw 76 pitches. Elias walked 2 and struck out 7 in the outing at Jacksonville.

<u>PERSONAL</u>: ROW-nes eh-LEE-us...Defected from Cuba in 2010. When he was in Cuba, he pitched for the Guantanamo team and last pitched there in 2010. Left Cuba on a boat with 16 other Cubans. It landed in Cancun, Mexico. The boat — which was organized by people Elias said he did not know — departed without a problem. For the next 30 hours, Elias and the other passengers sailed across the Atlantic Ocean, braving the high seas and hoping they were not caught by authorities in international waters that would send them back to Cuba. Finally, with a back-pack full of clothes as his only possession, Elias landed in Cancun, Mexico — he was officially a Cuban defector. While the first step of successfully escaping Cuba was completed, things did not necessarily get easier for Elias. He

was now in a foreign country without a visa, did not have a baseball team to play for and had no way of getting to the U.S. Elias said he and the five other baseball players on the boat "laid low" in a hotel room in Cancun, biding their time until they could get the paperwork necessary to be in Mexico — a process Elias declined to elaborate on. Once the proper paperwork was acquired, he traveled nearly 1,600 miles to Monterrey, Mexico, where he had a tryout with the local professional team. He didn't get cut, but he didn't exactly make the team either. Monterrey had an "A" team for its top players, and a "B" team for its less talented group. Elias was placed on the "B" team and told he didn't have a chance to be signed by a Major League franchise. Undeterred, Elias finished out the season and spent the offseason in Monterrey working out and improving. He attended one open tryout where a few Major League scouts were present but received no offers. He attended a second open tryout in May of 2011, and this time he caught the eye of a Seattle Mariners scout. He was signed on May 3 and made his U.S. debut on July 17 in rookie ball, more than eight months after climbing onto a tiny boat and leaving the only home he'd ever known.

2013 Season:

2012 Season: went 11-6 with a 3.76 ERA (62 ER, 148.1 IP) in 26 starts with High Desert. Elias is only the 4th pitcher in franchise history to start at least 25 games and have an ERA under 4.00 in a single season. He joined John Patterson (2.83) and Brad Penny (2.96) in 1998 and Luis Galindez (3.87) in 1992. Elias' 11 wins last season currently ranks T8th in a single season by a Mavericks pitcher. Elias led the team with 12 quality starts including 6 of his final 8 starts of the season. During this 8 game stretch, from July 16-Aug. 31, he went 5-1 with a 2.34 ERA (13 ER, 50.0 IP). He recorded his first career double digit strikeout game with a career-high 11 K's in 7.2 innings on July 21 at Stockton.

2011 Season: Began pro career with Peoria in the Arizona, appearing in 1 games before transferring to Pulaski on July 18...recorded first career win July 24 at Danville (4.0,3,0,0,0,1)...transferred to Clinton on Aug. 1, making 7 starts...struck out career-high 8 batters but fell for first time in career on Aug. 20 vs. Kane County (5.0,7,5,5,4,8

Tonight's Start: 26-year-old Hector Noesi makes his home debut for the Generals tonight in game two of the doubleheader. Noesi made four spring training appearances (one start) and allowed nine earned runs in 4.2 innings pitched. Noesi was 2-12, with a 5.82 ERA for Seattle last season. He also was 2-6, with a 5.74 ERA for Triple-A Tacoma.

Last Outing: In his first Double-A start since 2010, Noesi allowed just two hits last Saturday in Jacksonville, during 6.0 shutout innings and a no decision. Noesi struck out five Suns and walked just one. The Generals lost 1-0 on a walkoff in the ninth.

PERSONAL: Hector (HEHK-ter) Noesi (noh-eh-SEE). Played for the World Team in the 2010 All-Star Futures Game... originally signed by New York (AL) as a non-drafted free agent on Dec. 3, 2004...compiled career minor league record of 30-18 with a 2.98 ERA in 97 appearances (74 GS).
