Franchise home runs for Jackson since the team came in 1998...

TODAY'S GAME: The Generals (3-5) continue their first homestand of the season, with the fourth game (1-2) of the five-game series against the Montgomery Biscuits tonight at The Ballpark in Jackson.

YOU ALREADY KNOW... that the Generals have opened the season 3-5. But, **DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Generals have out-scored their first two opponents 28-22 and 13 of the 28 runs scored have occurred in the 7th inning of games.

GENERALS RECAP: Brad Miller went 5-for-6 with two doubles and a home run Friday as Jackson split a doubleheader with Montgomery, in front of 3,676 fans. The Generals dropped game one, 5-4 and took game two, 4-2. LHP **Roenis Elias** suffered the loss in game one for Jackson. During the first game SS **Brad Miller**, C **John Hicks** and RF **James Jones** recorded multi-hit games. In game two, starter RHP **Hector Noesi** (1-0) tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and has opened his season not allowing a run in 11.0 innings pitched. RHP **Carson Smith** earned his second save of the season. 3B **Brad Miller** added three hits, including his second homer of the season. 3B **Vinnie Catricala** and Miller also added RBI doubles and RF **James Jones** blasted an RBI triple in game two.

WHO'S HOT: INF **Brad Miller** has hit safely in 6 of the first 8 games this season, batting .467 (14x30) with 5 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 2 home runs and 3 RBI. OF **Julio Morban** has not played in the last 3 games, but recorded multi-hit games in 3 of the first 5 games, batting .563 (9x16) with 3 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 3 RBI.

STARTERS STREAK: The Generals starting rotations streak of not allowing an earned run, was snapped at 28.2 innings during the first inning of game one of the doubleheader Friday.

NEARING 1,500 FRANCHISE HOME RUNS: Since 1998, the Jackson franchise has blasted 1,499 home runs. The Generals are holding a contest on the teams Facebook page on who will blast the franchise's 1,500 long ball.

40-MAN FRENZY: For the first time since Jackson has been affiliated with Seattle (2007) they boast 6 players who are on the Mariners 40-man roster. Starting pitchers **Hector Noesi** and **Chance Ruffin**, infielder **Vinnie Catricala** outfielders **Francisco Martinez** and **Julio Morban** and starter **Anthony Fernandez** who is currently on the DL.

COMING FROM BIG LEAGUE CAMP: The Opening Day roster features 12 players that participated in Major League Spring Training. Those included position players **Abraham Almonte**, **Vinnie Catricala**, **John Hicks**, **Francisco Martinez**, **Brad Miller**, **Julio Morban** and pitchers **Jonathan Arias**, **Tyler Burgoon**, **Stephen Kohnschoen**, **Hector Noesi**, **Chance Ruffin**, **Carson Smith** and **Taijuan Walker**.

"PANK" MOVING ON UP: Coming back for his 3rd season, Manager Jim Pankovits becomes the second-longest tenured Jackson manager. Bobby Dickerson managed in Jackson from 2002-2005 while Jackson was affiliated with the Chicago Cubs. Pankovits is T-2nd in franchise history with 150 managerial wins.

PLENTY OF PROSPECTS: The Generals Opening Day roster features 11 of the Mariners' T30 prospects, according to Baseball America. Those include: RHP **Taijuan Walker** (2), INF **Brad Miller** (9), RHP **Carson Smith** (16), OF **Leon Landry** (17), INF **Jack Marder** (20), C **John Hicks** (21), OF **Francisco Martinez** (22), OF **Julio Morban** (23), INF **Vinnie Catricala** (26), RHP **Chance Ruffin** (27), LHP **Anthony Fernandez** (30).

THIS DAY IN BASEBALL HISTORY

1990 The first sellout in Mariners history occurs when 54,874 fans attend the season home opener at the Kingdome. The Friday the 13th crowd leaves disappointed when Seattle is routed by Oakland, 15-7.
2011 Chipper Jones spoils Florida's bid for a shutout when he homers in the bottom of the ninth inning of the Braves' 5-1 loss at Turner Field. The Atlanta third baseman joins Eddie Murray (1,917) and Mickey Mantle (1,509) in becoming only the third switch hitter in major league history to compile 1,500 RBIs.

Tonight's Start: 24-year-old Chance Ruffin his second career start and first start at home for the Generals Ruffin has pitched in 94 minor league games and 15 major league games, but this will be his second start.. Ruffin made 3 spring training appearances and allowed three earned runs in 3.0 innings pitched. Ruffin was 0-5, with a 5.99 ERA for Tacoma last season in 50 games.

Last Outing: Ruffin earned the win last Sunday in the Generals 10-0 thrashing of the Suns in Jacksonville. Ruffin tossed 6.0 shutout innings on just two hits. Ruffin struck out one and walked none.

PERSONAL: Chance Kraig Ruffin...resides in Austin, TX with wife Katie and golden retriever Millie... Originally selected by Detroit in the supplemental first round of the 2010 June draft (48th overall)... played college baseball at the University of Texas...went 24-6 with 19 saves and a 2.39 ERA (71 ER, 267.1 IP) in 85 games/28 starts at UT...2008 Big 12 Freshman of the Year...father, Bruce, pitched for 12 years in the Major Leagues with Philadelphia, Milwaukee and Colorado, posting a 60-82 record with 63 saves.

2012 Season: Spent entire season with AAA Tacoma, going 0-5 with 1 save and a 5.99 ERA (47 ER, 70.2 IP) in 50 relief appearances.

• Led all Rainiers relievers in games (50) and innings (70.2)...stranded 14 of 19 inherited runners.

• Posted a 2.59 ERA (7 ER, 24.1 IP) in 17 appearances following the All-Star break, compared to a 7.77 ERA (40 ER, 46.1 IP) in 33 appearances prior to the All-Star break.

• Traveled with the Mariners to Japan as part of 30-man roster for regular season games vs. Mariners, but did not pitch.

2011 Season: Was 1-0, 4.08 (8 ER, 17.2 IP) in 13 relief appearances with Seattle...earned first Major League win Aug. 22 at Cleveland with a scoreless 8th inning... Chance (1-0) and his father, Bruce (60-82, 63 SV), became the 30th pair of father/sons with at least 1 career win in MLB history...acquired from Detroit on Aug. 17 as PTBNL in July 30 trade...selected to Major League roster by Detroit July 25 and made MLB debut that night at Chicago (AL)... was the 3rd player from the 2010 draft class to appear in the Major Leagues (Chris Sale - CWS, Josh Spence - SD).

2010 Season: Made his pro debut with the Surprise Rafters in the Arizona Fall League, posting a 1-1 record with 4 saves and a 3.86 ERA (4 ER, 9.1 IP) in 10 relief appearances...as a junior at Texas, earned All-Big 12 Conference and Baseball America All-America honors...named the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Stopper of the Year...led the NCAA in strikeouts per 9.0 innings (13.49) and ranked 2nd in ERA (1.11).

2009 Season: Appeared in 26 combined games (20 GS) with Charleston and Tampa...began the season with 27.1 consecutive scoreless innings over his first 9 appearances (3 starts), striking out 35 and walking only 3...named a South Atlantic League midseason All-Star... on the disabled list from July 19-Aug. 2 with right shoulder tendinitis...made pair of postseason relief appearances for the FSL Champion Tampa squad, including earning the win in Game 1 of the Championship Series at Port Charlotte.

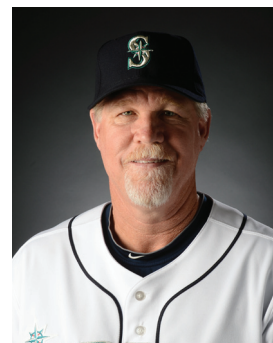
