Jackson starters' ERA through the first 12 games...

TODAY'S GAME: The Generals (6-6) and T-2nd place in the SL North take on the Mississippi Braves (4-8) this morning at Trustmark in game three (1-1) of the five-game series. Jackson is 2-1 in day games this season and all-time is 81-79 against the Braves. 24-year-old **Roenis Elias** makes his third start for the Generals. This is his first career start against the Braves and 37th overall start in his pro career. The lefty who was born in Cuba is 16-9 in his career, with a 3.90 career ERA.

YOU ALREADY KNOW... that the Generals have faced Jacksonville, Montgomery and Mississippi so far this season. But, **DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Generals will not play a team from their own North Division until April 20 at Chattanooga. Jackson's first 20 games are against South Division opponents.

GENERALS RECAP: The M-Braves evened the series on Tuesday morning with a 2-1 victory over the Generals (6-6) at Trustmark Park. Pitching once again dominated as Jackson fell despite out-hitting Mississippi 6-5. The General's loss snapped a Braves six-game losing streak and ended Jackson's four-game winning streak.

WHO'S HOT: Generals Pitching leads the SL with a 2.66 ERA this season. The staff also leads the league in opponents batting average at .202 and ranks second with 95 strikeouts. OF **James Jones** has reached base safely in his last 8 games (.448 OBP), batting .333 (8x24) with 3 doubles, 2 triples, a home run and 7 RBI. Jones has also walked 5 times. LH **James Gillheeneey** is 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 11.0) IP in his first 2 starts this season. He has limited opponents to a .158 (6x38), while walking 4 and striking out 3 in 11.0 innings.

CLOSE CALLS: So far this season, 7 of the Generals first 12 games have been decided by 1 run. Jackson is 3-4 in those games.

HOME SWEET HOME FOR MILLER: INF **Brad Miller** has 10-game hitting streak at home that dates back to August 14 of last season. During the streak Miller is batting .465 (20x43) at The Ballpark in Jackson with 3 doubles, 2 triples, 2 home runs, 3 RBI and 3 walks.

GENERALS BLAST FRANCHISE'S 1,500TH HOMER: Steven Proscia's 2-run blast in the third inning Saturday night was not only his second of the season, but 1,500th since the franchise arrived in Jackson in 1998. The current total sits at 1,502.

WEEKLY HONORS SWEEP: The Generals swept the first edition of the Southern League Players of the Week Monday as INF **Brad Miller** was named the SL Hitter of the Week and RHP **Hector Noesi** was named SL Pitcher of the Week. Noesi was promoted to Tacoma on Monday.

COMING FROM BIG LEAGUE CAMP: The Opening Day roster features 12 players that participated in Major League Spring Training. Those included position players **Abraham Almonte**, **Vinnie Catricala**, **John Hicks**, **Francisco Martinez**, **Brad Miller**, **Julio Morban** and pitchers **Jonathan Arias**, **Tyler Burgoon**, **Stephen Koshcheen**, **Hector Noesi**, **Chance Ruffin**, **Carson Smith** and **Taijuan Walker**.

"PANK" MOVING ON UP: Coming back for his 3rd season, Manager Jim Pankovits becomes the second-longest tenured Jackson manager. Bobby Dickerson managed in Jackson from 2002-2005 while Jackson was affiliated with the Chicago Cubs. Pankovits is now 2nd in franchise history with 153 wins.

PLENTY OF PROSPECTS: The Generals Opening Day roster features 11 of the Mariners' Top 30 prospects, according to Baseball America. Those include: RHP **Taijuan Walker** (2), INF **Brad Miller** (9), RHP **Carson Smith** (16), OF **Leon Landry** (17), INF **Jack Marder** (20), C **John Hicks** (21), OF **Francisco Martinez** (22), OF **Julio Morban** (23), INF **Vinnie Catricala** (26), RHP **Chance Ruffin** (27), LHP **Anthony Fernandez** (30).

Tonight's Start: 24-year-old Roenis Elias makes his third start for the Generals. This is his first career start against the Braves and 37th overall start in his pro career. The lefty from Austin, Texas overall is 16-9, with a 3.90 career ERA.

Last Outing: Elias allowed five runs on seven hits in 5.0 innings during the 5-4 loss in game one of the doubleheader last Friday at The Ballpark in Jackson. Elias struck out four and walked just one in his second start of the year.

PERSONAL: ROW-nes eh-LEE-us...Defected from Cuba in 2010. When he was in Cuba, he pitched for the Guantanamo team and last pitched there in 2010. Left Cuba on a boat with 16 other Cubans. It landed in Cancun, Mexico. The boat — which was organized by people Elias said he did not know — departed without a problem. For the next 30 hours, Elias and the other passengers sailed across the Atlantic Ocean, braving the high seas and hoping they were not caught by authorities in international waters that would send them back to Cuba. Finally, with a backpack full of clothes as his only possession, Elias landed in Cancun, Mexico — he was officially a Cuban defector. While the first step of successfully escaping Cuba was completed, things did not necessarily get easier for Elias. He was now in a foreign country without a visa, did not have a baseball team to play for and had no way of getting to the U.S. Elias said he and the five other baseball players on the boat "laid low" in a hotel room in Cancun, biding their time until they could get the paperwork necessary to be in Mexico — a process Elias declined to elaborate on. Once the proper paperwork was acquired, he traveled nearly 1,600 miles to Monterrey, Mexico, where he had a tryout with the local professional team. He didn't get cut, but he didn't exactly make the team either. Monterrey had an "A" team for its top players, and a "B" team for its less talented group. Elias was placed on the "B" team and told he didn't have a chance to be signed by a Major League franchise. Undeterred, Elias finished out the season and spent the offseason in Monterrey working out and improving. He attended one open tryout where a few Major League scouts were present but received no offers. He attended a second open tryout in May of 2011, and this time he caught the eye of a Seattle Mariners scout. He was signed on May 3 and made his U.S. debut on July 17 in rookie ball, more than eight months after climbing onto a tiny boat and leaving the only home he'd ever known.

2013 Season:

• Tossed six no-hit innings in his season-debut on April 5 at Jacksonville.

2012 Season: went 11-6 with a 3.76 ERA (62 ER, 148.1 IP) in 26 starts with High Desert. Elias is only the 4th pitcher in franchise history to start at least 25 games and have an ERA under 4.00 in a single season. He joined John Patterson (2.83) and Brad Penny (2.96) in 1998 and Luis Galindez (3.87) in 1992. Elias' 11 wins last season currently ranks T8th in a single season by a Mavericks pitcher. Elias led the team with 12 quality starts including 6 of his final 8 starts of the season. During this 8 game stretch, from July 16-Aug. 31, he went 5-1 with a 2.34 ERA (13 ER, 50.0 IP). He recorded his first career double digit strikeout game with a career-high 11 K's in 7.2 innings on July 21 at Stockton.

2011 Season: Began pro career with Peoria in the Arizona, appearing in 1 games before transferring to Pulaski on July 18...recorded first career win July 24 at Danville (4.0,3,0,0,0,1)...transferred to Clinton on Aug. 1, making 7 starts...struck out career-high 8 batters but fell for first time in career on Aug. 20 vs. Kane County (5.0,7,5,5,4,8)

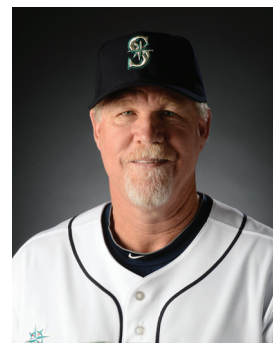
